



Top Ten Causes of Death for African American Men

- Heart Disease 27%

- COPD/Lung Disease 2%

• Stroke – 5%

• Homicide - 2%

Colonoscopy and Colon Cancer Screening


Colonoscopy is the gold standard and the only test that can detect and can remove pre-cancerous polyps

Having screening done decreases your risk of colon cancer by 90% and risk of death from colon cancer 99%

Stool DNA screening (Cologuard) detects polyps or early cancer at a rate of 92%

Colonoscopy screening detects polyps or early colon cancer at a rate of 99%

***60% of Americans that should be screened are screened

Dr. Ronald Taylor is a native New Yorker, and he received his bachelor's degree from the State University of New York at Stony Brook. He enrolled in dental school at the University of Maryland and during his time there he did an externship at the University of Dundee Dental School in Dundee, Scotland. After completing his dental training and receiving his Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS) from the University of Maryland he returned to New York and completed a General Practice Residency (GPR) program at The Bronx-Lebanon Hospital Center. He completed his endodontic specialty training and successfully defended his thesis, receiving his certification in endodontics and his Master of Science in Dentistry (MSD) from Case Western Reserve University. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and a member of the American Association of Endodontists, the American Dental Association, and the National Dental Association.

Dr. Taylor is the founder and CEO of Trident Endo, which provides management support services for six brands of endodontic group practices with a total of 11 locations, located in Maryland, Washington DC, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey. He has served as an associate professor at Howard University College of Dentistry and as a Dean's Faculty clinical assistant professor at the University of Maryland Dental School. He has been a mock board examiner for endodontic residents in the United States Navy Post Graduate Endodontic Residency Program, the Medical College of Virginia, Boston University, and the University of Maryland. He has been appointed by the American Board of Endodontics College of Diplomates to serve as a mentor to board eligible endodontists. Today he serves on the Board of Directors for the College of Diplomates. Dr. Taylor is a past president of the Penick Endodontic Study Club, one of the nation's premier endodontic study clubs. He was previously selected to Bethesda Magazine and Washingtonian Magazine's List of Top Dentists.

One of the greatest things he ever did in his life was become a Fall 1989 Initiate of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., at the Mu Omicron Chapter at Stony Brook University. Ron is a Life Member of Kappa Alpha Psi and a member of the College Park /Sandy Spring (MD) Alumni Chapter where he has served on the Guide Right, Reclamation and Retention and Health and Wellness committees. He currently serves on the Board of Directors for College Park /Sandy Spring.

Dr. Taylor is married to his lovely wife Chalissa and has two beautiful children, Kayla and Evan. He enjoys traveling, grilling, deep-sea fishing, and music.




Ean Vessels "Diplomatik Immunity"

He also has worked as recruitment liaison and peer support counselor. In addition, Ean and a group of 10 African American officers also started a book club for likeminded people to discuss a wide variety of topics. Most recently the United States Congress awarded Ean Vessels and all his colleagues who worked on January 6, 2021, with the Congressional Gold Medal.


